Finances

- Kansas School for the Deaf support for 1.5 positions in birth-three
- Started with \$3000.00
- Partnered to get grants
- Charged a nominal fee (\$25-30 per day of training)
- Financial spiral effect

Direct Support

Funded by Kansas School for the Deaf

- 1.5 positions
 - 1.0 Deaf Educator
 - .5 SLP

Utilize Outreach Department for additional supports
