
• <u>Funding</u> from HRSA and CDC has supported the establishment of early hearing detection and intervention in the FSM. Without funding, this initiative would not have been possible and now hearing screening is part of a newborn's standard of care and is being fully established in the FSM.



 Establishing early hearing detection and intervention in the FSM has resulted in the early identification of 9 infants with hearing loss in Pohnpei State. Through NCHAMS support in August, 2010 Yusnita and Jean visited Pohnpei brought DAE equipment and completed the DAEs on these babies. FSM is now working on getting DAE services to the other FSM States.



 The EHDI project has brought a closer collaborative partnership between health and special education in serving children with special health care needs, particularly for young children under 5 years.





• Conducting a major **EHDI Symposium in August**, **2010** brought health and education together to plan the next steps in moving forward in FSM-EHDI. The opportunity to focus 3 days on steps to improvement and to work with doctors, nurses, teachers, administrators, data coordinators, and parents resulted in a very successful event.



 Young families in the FSM are learning the importance of prevention rather than intervention when thinking about health care for their children. The EHDI program has improved the quality of life in the FSM

What FSM-EHDI will accomplish this year

- Achieve benchmark of 95% initial hearing screening for all 4 FSM States
- Continue upgrade and follow up training for screeners to improve hearing screening referrals rates
- Continue to monitor lost to follow up rates at all levels and keep these levels to 10% or less
- Purchase DAE equipment and begin process for designing and implementing a teleaudiology options for follow up DAEs
- Provide early intervention workshops for those professionals serving or will be serving infants and families with hearing loss
- Continue to monitor progress at all levels and improving hearing screening rooms at all FSM States
- Continue development and fully operational tracking and surveillance system to monitor hearing screening and intervention at all States.
- Continue to improve the quality of life for all families in the FSM.
