 - Private time to discuss feelings and insecurities
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
- Professionals/Pre-professionals

 - ~ can be done all in one session or broken into several sessions
 - ~ can be used for parents or professionals

- ~ Include professionals who can help facilitate on-going interaction


CARE for NC EHDI
